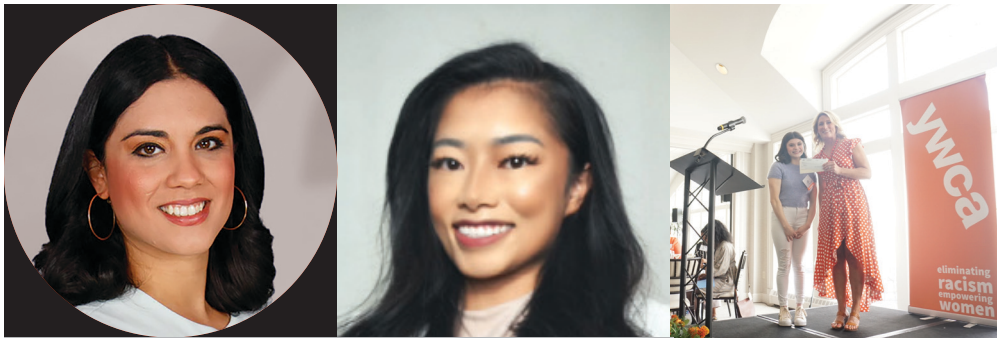

The WCC provides free, work-appropriate clothing to women who are currently employed or actively seeking employment. We remove the financial barrier by offering this basic need.

Childcare and Development

Our licensed childcare program provides care for children ages 6 weeks - 13 years old. Our caring and dedicated staff partner with parents to prepare children for success in school, celebrate diversity, and learn important life-skills.

Health & Safety

Aquatics

Swimming is a life skill, especially in a city surrounded by water! Our aquatic center offers swim lessons for all abilities and ages. We offer many opportunities for adults to use our facilities to exercise including lap swimming, water walking, aerobic workouts, joint exercises, and more.

Wellness

Our professionally certified trainers are a group of life-loving women who are here to provide fitness instruction, wellness seminars, and other resources to promote health and safety.

Justice & Advocacy

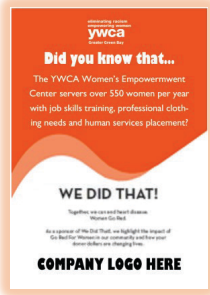

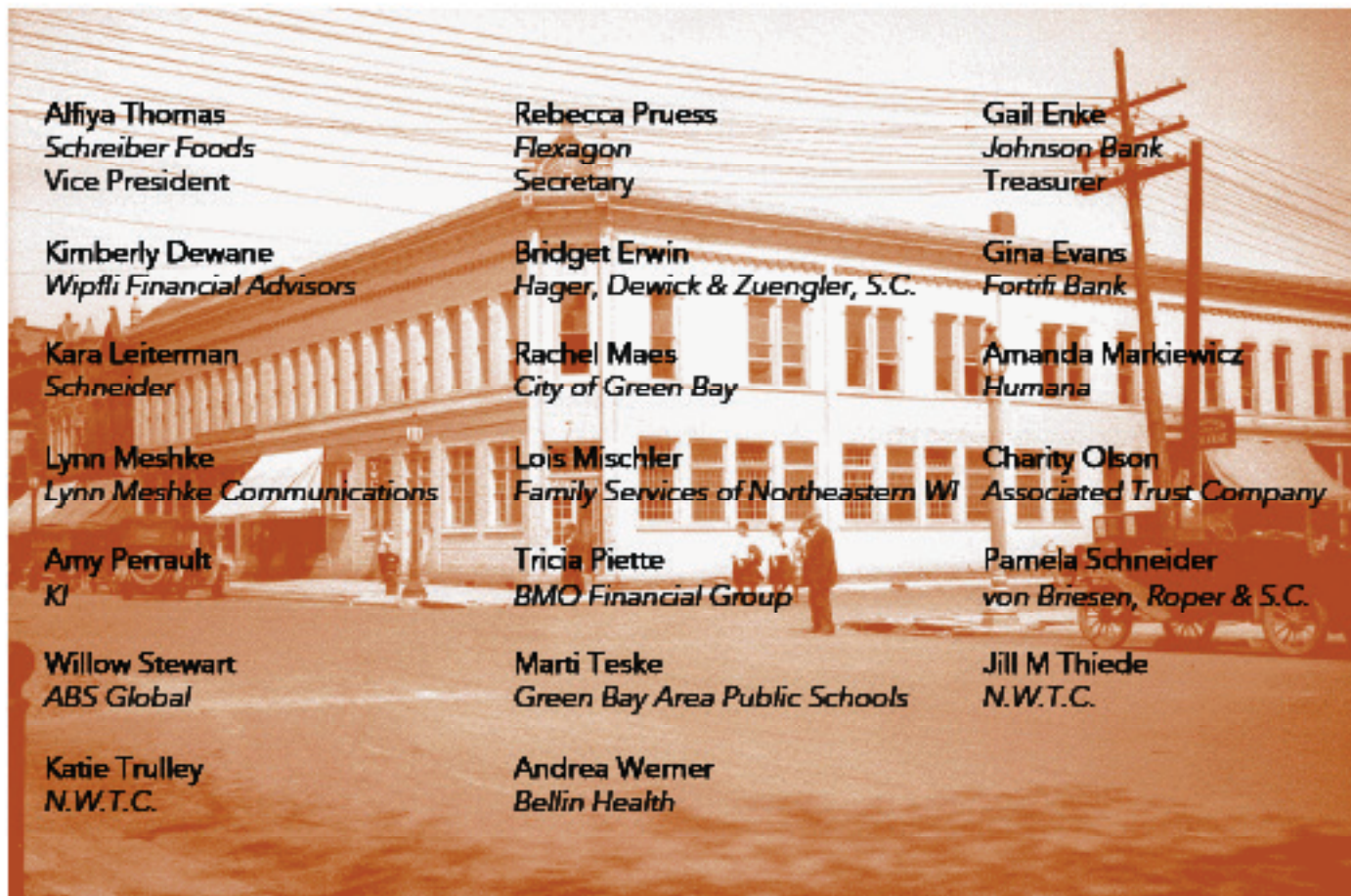
